This new cut of Seth Fein's transhistorical diptych moves between original and archival footage to explore the present and past of interborough and international imperialism and immigration that orbit the Unisphere in Queens, between today and the 1960s, the age of Donald Trump and that of Robert Moses. *Between Neighborhoods* won the Founders Choice Award for Documentary at the Queens World Film Festival. Seth Fein is an audiovisual historian and artist. He teaches in Brooklyn College's Film Department and in its Feirstein Graduate School of Cinema and operates Seven Local Film in Queens. His new documentary *Our Neighborhood* (in production) examines Washington's TV Cold War against the Cuban Revolution in Latin America across the 1960s. He has also published extensively on the crossborder history of screen cultures and politics across the Americas.
